Fiction

David Guterson, PEN Faulkner Award winner for *Snow Falling on Cedars*, and author of *Our Lady of the Forest*, *East of the Mountains* and *The Country Ahead of Us, The Country Behind*.

James Galvin, author of the novel *Fencing the Sky*, the prose work *The Meadow*, several collections of poetry, and winner of the Lila Wallace-Reader's Digest Foundation award.

Literary Non-fiction

Alexandra Fuller, winner of the Booksense award for Non-Fiction Book of the Year for her memoir *Don't Let's Go to the Dogs Tonight: An African Childhood*, and author of *Scribbling the Cat: Travels with an African Soldier*, winner of the Lettre Ulysses Award for the Art of Reportage 2005.

Craig Lesley, author of the memoir, *Burning Fence*, and four novels, *Storm Riders*, *The Sky Fisherman*, *River Song*, and *Winterkill*, and winner of three Pacific Northwest Booksellers Association Awards, the Western

Writers of America Golden Spur Award for Best Novel, and an Oregon Book Award.

Robert Michael Pyle, author of *Chasing Monarchs: Migrating with the Butterflies of Passage*, *The Thunder Tree*, *Where Bigfoot Walks: Crossing the Dark Divide* and *Wintergreen*, winner of the 1987 John Burroughs Medal for Distinguished Nature Writing.

Linda Hussa, author of three books of poetry, including the compilation *Sharing Fencelines*, *Three Friends Write from Nevada*™s Sagebrush Corner, and *Blood Sister, I Am To These Fields* and winner of the 1999 Nevada Writer's Hall of Fame's Silver Pen Award.

Lawson Inada, Oregon™s Poet Laureate and author of *Before The War* and *Legends From Camp*, for which he received the American Book Award.

Robert Wrigley, author of many poetry collections including *Lives of the Animals*; *Reign of Snakes*, winner of the Kingsley Tufts Award; and *In the Bank of Beautiful Sins*, winner of the San Francisco Poetry Center Book Award.
