

Bend High Teacher Named to All-USA Teacher Team

Bend High School's Robert Tadjiki is among a handful of teachers nationwide to be named to USA TODAY's All-USA Teacher Team today. The 2006 All-USA Teacher Team includes 19 individuals and a team of two (21 teachers in total) in grades K-12.

"I teach because I love to see students become successful and because I want to give kids a chance to make a difference in our society," he adds. "My students with disabilities have made some pretty incredible impacts in our community while only being young adults." Tadjiki has been teaching special education students for more than 11 years.
