

Venezuela: Weapons seized ahead of vote

CARACAS, Venezuela -- Venezuelan police said Wednesday they seized weapons and other items in the capital that were to be used to disrupt an upcoming vote. The weapons, seized in a Caracas home during the weekend, allegedly were going to be used during the Dec. 2 referendum vote on the overhaul of the Venezuelan constitution, El Universal reported. Opponents of the proposed changes to Venezuelan law say President Hugo Chavez is trying to create a Cuba-style communist state in the South American country, the report said. Among the 69 "reforms" proposed is an end to presidential term limits.
