

## Former motel clerk sought in Days Inn robbery

Police are looking for the former front desk clerk of a northeast Bend motel who in August reported an armed robbery, but whom they now believe made up the story and is responsible for the theft himself.

Luis Humberto Rivera-Torres: photo provided by BPD Since August 9, Bend Police detectives have been investigating the report made by Luis Humberto Rivera-Torres, the only Days Inn employee on duty at the time of the incident they now believe didnâ€™t happen, Detective Brian Beekman said.

Rivera-Torres was indicted by a Deschutes County Grand Jury and an arrest warrant was issued for initiating a false report and first-degree theft, a news release stated. This is not the first time he has had contact with law enforcement - according to online police reports, Rivera-Torres was cited for second-degree theft on June 11 at 61479 S. Hwy. 97, which is the location of a Taco Time restaurant.

While declining to say the amount of money the suspect allegedly took from the Days Inn, the detective indicated it would have to be a minimum of \$750 in order to warrant the first-degree stipulation related to the theft charge.

At the time, Rivera-Torres told police that one man armed with a knife robbed the motel at 849 NE Third Street while another man acted as a lookout. He said both men then fled the scene on foot, and gave a very detailed description of the knife-wielding “robber” right down to his race, age, height, build, color and length of hair, piercings, tattoos, and clothing, Lt. Ken Stenkamp said.
