The unnamed employee noticed the fire and attempted to use a dry-chem extinguisher, but the extinguisher didn't work, Battalion Chief Bill Boos said. She immediately vacated the building, and an alarm was raised about 3 a.m., January 4. Over a dozen firefighters arrived on scene at 62980 N. Highway 97 were able to quickly extinguish the blaze using a CO2 extinguisher, which according to Boos, "mitigated the mess―.
