Dominick was instrumental in the federal roadless conservation policy and the designation of new national monuments while with the World Wildlife Fund. For his achievements in conservation, Dr. DellaSala received WWF's™ President's™ Award in 2000 and 2004 and the Wilburforce Foundation Conservation Leadership Award in 2005.
