

80th Academy Awards nominations announced

Nominations for the 80th Annual Academy Awards were announced Tuesday by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences.

The nominations were announced by academy President Sid Ganis and Oscar winner Kathy Bates in a Beverly Hills, Calif., news conference.

Academy members selected the nominees in their respective branches, with the exception of the Animated Feature Film and Foreign Language Film categories, in which nominations were selected by vote of multi-branch screening committees, according to a press release issued Tuesday.

Official screenings of all pictures with one or more nominations will begin this weekend for members at the Academy's Samuel Goldwyn Theater. Screenings also will be held at the Academy's Linwood Dunn Theater in Hollywood and in London, New York and the Bay Area.

The winners will be presented on Feb. 24 at the Kodak Theatre at Hollywood.
