As of November 16, the 2006-07 United Way of Deschutes County (UWDC) Annual Campaign has raised \$754,635, 52% of the goal. The campaign kicked off in mid-September with a \$1,450,000 goal to help support 34 local health & human service programs in the county. Money is raised by reaching out to our community through presentations in the workplace, small businesses and individuals.
