

Sunriver To Host 2007 USGA Senior Women's Amateur

Sunriver Resort has been selected by the United States Golf Association as the site of the 2007 USGA Senior Women's Amateur. The dates of the championship are scheduled for September 1-6. The Meadows Course at Sunriver Resort was opened in 1969 and was revised in 1999 by John Fought, an Oregonian who won the 1977 U.S. Amateur. Seven holes of the course border the Sun River. Sunriver's Meadow Course has previously served as the site of the 2002 U.S. Women's Amateur Public Links Championship, which was won by Annie Thurman-Young. The Meadow Course has also hosted the 2005 NCAA Division I Women's Championship. "We are excited about hosting our second USGA Championship at Sunriver Resort," said Rich Taylor, co-general chairman. "The entire resort staff, volunteers, and golf department are already preparing to provide a memorable experience for the player, families and friends."
