Two arrested in SE Bend marijuana-grow by Cheryl McDermott Detectives raided a southeast Bend residence Tuesday and found an active and sophisticated marijuana growing operation, then on Wednesday during a high-risk traffic stop, arrested the man and woman who reside in the home as they were returning from an out-of-state trip. Detectives found 90 marijuana plants in a home in southeast Bend, Oregon - CODE photo -- found in various stages of growth -- had grown to maturity, they would be worth about \$144,000 in street value - CODE photo Joseph Michael Anderson (left), and Melinda Dawn Sweet (right) - DCJ photos 25-year old Joseph Michael Anderson and Melinda Dawn Sweet, 28, both of 20241 Silver Sage Street in Bend, were taken into custody near milepost 20 on Highway 20 east of town, Bend Police Lt. John Gautney reported. The couple was returning from a trip to Idaho. According to Gautney, an unnamed Bend Police detective received information about an alleged pot-grow at

the Silver Sage Street address, and contacted the Central Oregon Drug Enforcement (CODE) team for

assistance.
A search warrant was obtained, and on February 19 about 9:45 p.m., police officers and members of the Deschutes County Street Crimes Unit (SCU) and CODE executed the warrant.
Two of the home's bedrooms were converted to actively grow pot, and detectives seized 90 marijuana plants in various stages of growth, plus over 400 grams of processed pot and packaging materials, the lieutenant said.
