

## FYI Travel: Oregon's Heceta Head Lighthouse welcomes overnight visitors

Oregon's share of the Pacific coastline owes its international reputation to the rugged beauty and natural wonders found along its 363-mile stretch. Unlike other states, all of Oregon's beaches are protected from encroachment and entirely open to the public, so visitors can play along the Pacific and experience its pristine splendor.

The quaint and cozy rooms perched next to Heceta Head Lighthouse overlook the mighty Pacific Ocean and offer one of the best vantage points for storm and marine wildlife watching on the central Oregon Coast. First illuminated in 1894, Heceta Head is one of only a few lighthouses across the country that has overnight accommodations. The owners, both certified executive chefs, serve up tempting seven-course breakfasts for their guests, highlighting fresh herbs, cheeses, produce and pastries.

### FROM THE WEST COAST TO THE WEST BANK
