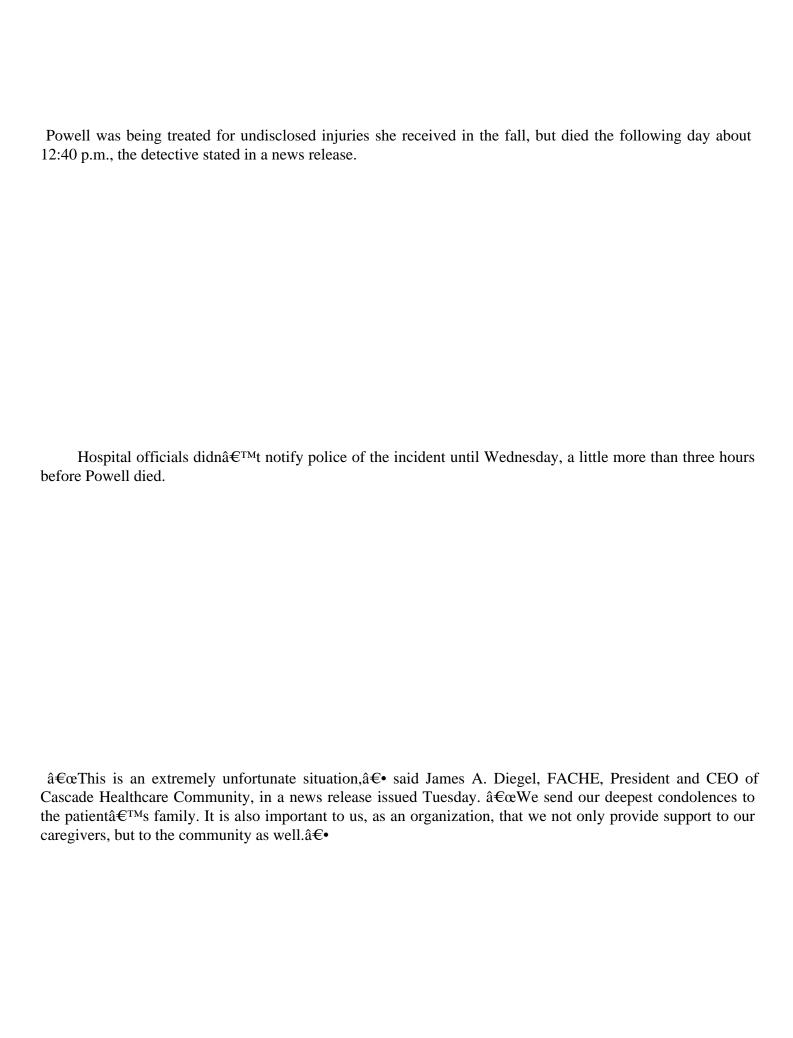
Details revealed in Bend hospital patient's suicide by Cheryl McDermott BEND, Ore. -- Hospital officials and Bend Police on Thursday revealed the identity of the patient, a 51-year old Redmond woman, who, in a suicide attempt, broke away from her escorts, ran up a flight of stairs and jumped from a second-floor balcony to the lobby of St. Charles Medical Center. She died the next day from her injuries. St. Charles Medical Center Cynthia "Cindy" Louise Powell, 51, was being treated at the Bend, Oregon hospital for mental health-related problems, Bend Police Detective Scott Vincent said. Powell reportedly had a history of multiple suicide attempts over the years, and was being escorted through the lobby by two hospital employees when she darted away and ran up a flight of stairs.

Vincent said Powell "immediately climbed over the top of the railing and jumped― to the main floor on Tuesday about 8:20 p.m. Vincent was being taken to Sage View, a nearby residential psychiatric facility.



The hospital provided trauma counseling services in both one-on-one and group settings for "anyone affected― by the tragedy, including caregivers and members of the public.
Hospital administrators said that a new policy of using wheelchairs for all future mental-health transfers has been instituted.
At the request of Powell's family, her organs were donated to the Pacific Northwest Transplant Bank, Det. Vincent said.
