According to a news release, Hunt and his passenger, 24-year old Zachary Mack of Omak, Washington, consented to a search of the vehicle.

Several bags of marijuana were discovered. Troopers said the approximate 11 pounds of pot is worth over \$27,000 on the street.
Hunt and Mack were arrested and lodged in the Douglas County Jail, OSP reported. They are both charged with possession and delivery of marijuana.
OSP is continuing the investigation.
