Six injured in school bus crash by Cheryl McDermott SALEM, Ore. -- Four students, a school bus driver, and the driver of the pickup that apparently crashed into the back of the Williamette Valley Christian School bus as it prepared to turn left an a northeast Salem intersection were injured Wednesday morning and sent to the hospital with injuries ranging from minor to serious but non life-threatening. The bus struck another car following impact, but that driver was not hurt, deputies reported. Four children, a school bus driver, and the operator of the pickup shown above were injured in a crash at a Salem, Oreon intersection Wednesday morning - MCSO photo According to a Marion County Sheriff's Office news release, deputies and paramedics with Marion County Fire District # 1 responded to Cordon Road NE and Sunnyview Road NE in Salem about 7:30 a.m.

Preliminary investigation shows that, for an unknown reason, a 1969 Chevrolet pickup driven by 71-year old Salem resident, Cecil Todd, struck the small bus as it was preparing to turn left onto Cordon Road NE. The bus then spun around and hit a 1999 Buick Park Avenue, and both of those vehicles came to rest in a field beside the road.
