A Central Oregon high school senior has been recognized by The Center Foundation as a "High Desert Hero". Trevor Schongalla was named the April High Desert Hero by the Board of Directors. Each High Desert Hero receives a \$100 scholarship, a \$25 gift certificate, and a medallion presented at their school. Trevor will be highlighted on the Horizon Broadcasting Group radio stations, COTV and the Kristi Miller Show. In the spring the High Desert Heroes are eligible to compete for the prestigious William K Worrell \$5,000 scholarship gifted by Connie Worrell-Druliner and Express Personnel. The scholarship is awarded at the May Scholarship Awards Dinner, a Salute to Heroes.
