The Virtual Phone Bank™ will enable volunteers to make phone calls to Oregonians from wherever they desire, while avoiding duplicate calls. Volunteers will even be able to print their own call lists of prospective voters and host phone banks in their own homes.

Using Turf Cutter™ Obama OCOs will be able to create maps of targeted households for our volunteers to canvass for change in their own communities.

Obama OCOs can even maximize their impact for the Obama campaign by learning to enter and manage data about the voters they have contacted across the state. Experienced OCOs can then learn to create their own lists of targeted voters.
