Bend High School's restaurant management team members will challenge students from 34 states this weekend as they vie for a championship at the National ProStart Invitational, April 20 -22 in Charlotte, North Carolina. According to team advisor Louise Markland, the Bend team is considered by many as the one to beat. "Last year they came in third in the nation, and the year prior they took home the national championship, so many are looking forward to seeing what this team will bring to the competition," she says. Markland says Bend High is bringing an experienced, dynamic team to the competition that has what it takes to bring home another national championship.
