

Oregon gas prices set new record high

Oregon statewide average gas prices set a new record high today at \$3.123 per gallon, according to AAA Public Affairs Director Elliott Eki.

The previous record of \$3.111 was set on May 28, 2006.

All major metro areas in Oregon have surpassed previous records, set in late May or early June of last year, Eki said.

At \$3.174, Eugene-Springfield surpassed their previous record of \$3.164.

Portland has topped their old record by one and one-half cents, reaching \$3.112.

The Medford-Ashland area has set a new record daily since Friday, and the average now stands at \$3.194.

Salem is also breaking records daily. On Thursday the area's price rose above the existing record of \$3.085, and today it is \$3.111.

While Oregon average gas prices cause shock at the gas pumps, the state is still far behind San Francisco's average of \$3.47 per gallon.
