Senate standoff on immigration bill

WASHINGTON -- Partisan bickering was threatening the immigration bill before the U.S. Senate Wednesday.

Democrats said they would force a time limit on the bill in an effort to curb Republican amendments to the immigration deal, The Washington Times reported.

Republicans vowed to block the time-limit move with a filibuster. Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid, D-Nev., said blocking the debate limit would kill the bill for the current session, the Times reported.

"People are looking for excuses on the Republican side to kill this bill," Reid told the Times.
