

Bend Cub Scouts set sail, seek "dead man's chest" at day camp

Bend-area Cub Scouts will learn while having boatloads of fun at day camp next week. Scouts converge on Shevlin Park June 25-28, with the theme of "Pirates." They'll practice buccaneer-style skills such as "aaaar-chery" and BB gun shooting, plus team sports, leather craft, and woodworking, among other activities.

Nature hikes, animal identification, and demonstrations by outdoor professionals are also included in the daily sessions, held at the park's Fremont Meadow from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Scouts also learn teamwork, citizenship and practice their community-service skills, and there's always the chance they'll find buried treasure.

Eye patches and shoulder parrots are optional.
