

Public invited to propose forest projects

BEND, Ore. - Applications for natural resource projects to benefit the Deschutes and Ochoco National Forests will be available starting June 22, 2007. This is an opportunity for citizens, community organizations and local governments to propose projects that improve the health of forests and watersheds. Projects may include obliterating or maintaining roads, trails, or existing infrastructure, restoring fish and wildlife habitat, removing noxious weeds, improving soil productivity, reducing hazardous fuels and reestablishing native species.

Under Title II of the Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act of 2000, also known as the "Payments to Counties" program, the Deschutes-Ochoco Resource Advisory Committee (RAC) will recommend the investment of approximately \$1 million this year to enhance local forests. The committee of Central Oregon residents will make recommendations from a pool of project applications submitted in response to this call for proposals.
