Warning signs will be posted prior to entering the Pedestrian Safety Operation area. A member of the Prineville Police Department, in plain clothes, will act as a decoy. "Please use caution as you enter the Pedestrian Safety zone,― Chief Eric Bush reminds. Pedestrians should always look both ways before entering a crosswalk, and drivers should adjust their speeds in congested areas where pedestrian traffic can be high.
